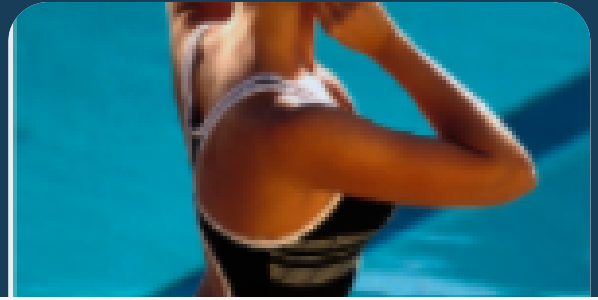


Swimming costume care



DO THIS FIRST · RINSE STRAIGHT AWAY

Rinse your costume in cold, clean water as soon as you can after swimming. It clears chlorine, salt, sunscreen and body oils before they damage the fabric.



01

HAND WASH ONLY

When it needs washing, gently hand wash in cool water with a little mild soap or swimwear detergent. No bleach, no fabric softener, and no machine, even on gentle.



02

DO NOT WRING

Never twist or wring the fabric. Gently squeeze out the water, or roll the costume in a clean towel to draw off the excess.

DRY FLAT IN THE SHADE

Lay it flat to dry in a ventilated, shaded spot. Direct sun and heat fade colour and weaken fabric. No tumble dryer, iron or heater.

PROTECT THE STRAPS

Don't hang a wet costume by its shoulder straps, the weight of the water stretches them. Lay it flat or drape it over a broad rail.



05

SUN CREAM

Sunscreen and body oils can stain or damage some fabrics. Apply it before you dress and let it absorb. Avoid rubbing sunscreen-covered hands onto the costume.



06

STORE IT DRY

Make sure the costume is completely dry before packing it away. Never leave it rolled inside a wet towel or sealed in your swim bag.
